Recruiting Now for 2019!

Parksville Volunteer Fire Department recruitment for 2019 is now underway. We are looking for enthusiastic men and women to become volunteer firefighters, your opportunity to be part of tradition. The Parksville Volunteer Fire Department is entrusted to protect the community we proudly serve. Volunteer firefighters play an important role in providing a timely response to emergency situations. We are looking for responsible and accountable team players who are willing to volunteer as firefighters.

You need to live in the Parksville fire protection area (ideally within City boundaries), be reasonably fit, available for weekly fire practices, have a good driving record and between the ages of 19 and 60 for regular members. Paid on call firefighters respond to emergencies 365 days a year. You will be trained, you will be challenged and your life will change. More details and applications are available from the firehall and the PVFD website parksvillefirerescue.ca. Application deadline is March 1 at 4 pm.

City Services

2019 Business Licences

Existing business licence holders may now renew for the 2019 calendar year. Renewal invoices will be mailed the first week in December. Fees are due by January 31, 2019, and may be mailed or paid at City Hall. Bylaw 1483 requires all businesses obtain a valid licence if carrying on business in the City. 2019 Dog Licences

Dog licence fees are due by January 31. Current dog licences will receive a reminder notice; if you do not receive a notice and currently own a dog, licences may be purchased from City Hall and the BC SPCA.

- By January 31, Spayed/neutered \$20, not spayed/neutered \$30
- After January 31, Spayed/neutered \$25, not spayed/neutered \$35

The main benefit of licensing is the quick return of dogs should they become lost. As well, fees collected help to offset the cost to maintain our off-leash dog park, provide bags and dispensers throughout the City and provide bylaw enforcement to handle public safety concerns of stray, off-leash and dangerous dogs.

2019 Council Meetings

Winter Conditions


Reminder to residents that snow clearing from sidewalks is the responsibility of the adjacent property owners who should ensure snow removed from the sidewalks is not deposited on the adjoining roadway. During heavy snowfall, in areas of heavy pedestrian traffic, adjacent to City-owned property, during regular office hours, crews will support public sidewalk clearing through use of snow blowers and other snow removal equipment as resources allow.
