Outdoor Burning Bylaw No. 1428

Can I burn yard waste in my backyard?

No. Burning any type of waste is prohibited in the City.

Can I have a fire on the beach?

No. Beach fires are prohibited by provincial legislation in the Parksville Qualicum Wildlife Management area.

Can I have a fire for a backyard cookout?

Yes, with some requirements:

Fuel must be charcoal, wood, propane or natural gas.

Fire must be contained in a BBQ, hibachi, fire pit or outdoor fireplace covered with a grate.

Fireplace must be less than 0.5 metres in size (diameter, width and depth) and less than 1.8 metres in height (including chimney)

A person 18 years or older must be present at all times.

Fire must be completely extinguished and residue disposed of to eliminate any fire hazard.



To report an open fire in the Parksville Fire Protection Area call 250 248-3242; to report a fire emergency call 911.

MAKING A COMPLAINT

To make a bylaw complaint you need to provide:

- Time, date and other details of incident.
- Location/address of incident.
- Your name, address, phone number and email

Did you know?

The fire protection area encompasses the City of Parksville, French Creek areas bordering the City of Parksville to the edge of the fire protection area at Johnston and Drew Roads, San Paniel, Fournneau Road, Wildgreen Road and Martindale Road areas.

Complaints can be submitted in person, by mail, by email or by phone.
